

## **Annual Medical School Dues**

In recognition of the disparity in the capacity of medical schools to afford membership and the wish to adopt as equitable formula as possible, IAOMC has adopted the following categories:

I. Ability to pay as determined by the World Bank's category of a country's latest Gross National Income (GNI) per capita.

Level 4 = High Income Countries	(earnings of \$12,276 or more)
Level 3 = Upper-Middle Income Countries	(earnings of \$3,976 to \$12,275)
Level 2 = Lower-Middle Income Countries	(earnings of \$1.006 to \$3,975)
Level 1 = Low Income Countries	(earnings of \$1,005 or less).
